## 1 INSTALLATION OF THE DRIVER




Open the data carrier.

Then the folder will open automatically. If it does not open, go to "Start" - "This PC" and open it manually.



1 Installation


Save the files in a folder on the desktop or in another folder on your computer. Name the folder, for example Date-HST-Tool-Manager-Version. If you save it in another folder we advise that you create a shortcut on the desktop. Then you can start HST-Tool-Manager.exe.



#### NOTE

The installation of drivers on a computer requires administrative rights. If you do not have these contact your IT department.


If the software does not open or the software does not recognise the tool check whether you have already installed the USB driver (ft232rl). To do this connect the tool to the computer via USB and open the device manager.



2 Adapter not recognised


The ft2323rl driver is not yet installed and does not correctly recognise the COM-Port.

After connecting the tool to the computer using the USB go to "New hardware detected" on the bottom right of your computer. The window for updating the driver software will open.




3 Manually search for driver

### **2 GENERAL INFORMATION**

#### 2.1 OVERVIEW

The HST-Tool-Manager is a programming interface which makes it possible to change the various parameters of the product features and functionality in all compatible tools. All settings for a tool are made with the HST-Tool-Manager via USB. The software does not require installation (only the driver has / needs to be installed).

A change in the tool can only be made if there is a connection to it.

Settings for a tool can be loaded for editing in the HST-Tool-Manager software. After the editing the file can be transferred back to the tool via USB.

#### 2.2 INTRODUCTION

The HST-Tool-Manager requires no installation and is available as an .exe file for download at https://www.hs-technik.eu/produkte/software:

The HST-Tool-Manager can be copied into any directory and executed directly. However all users will require write permissions for this directory.

## **3 READ OUT TOOL DATA**

In order to read out the data from a tool connect it to the computer via USB or connect via Wi-Fi.



Start the HST-Tool-Manager, log in and read out the current tool by clicking on "read". Now you can edit the settings as described in the following steps. So that the tool parametrization is not lost we recommend saving this separating under another name.









The basic information about the tool is displayed. Depending on the type of tool different information is displayed.


8 System time

If the system time and the time on the tool amounts to a difference of more than 30 seconds a warning will appear indicating that the system time is incorrect.

Click on "ok" in order to adjust to the time on the tool. The update system time is required in order to correctly record the time stamp of the wrenching process. Click "cancel" for no synchronisation to take place.

#### 4.1 LOGIN TO THE HST-TOOL-MANAGER

In order to start the HST-Tool-Manager you will need the login data as "evaluation", "programmer", "administrator", "network administrator", "calibration" or "service".





#### WHERE DO I FIND THE PASSWORDS?

The passwords are delivered in printed form upon delivery to the key contact, or purchaser for the tools.

In settings under "role" the passwords for the individual user types (roles) can be changed. To do this you must click on "change password".


Each user group may only be assigned 1 password. In order to change the password the current password is required.

After clicking "change password" for the corresponding user group, the pop-up window for changing the password opens. At the top, in the header of the window, the display indicates which user group the password change is being made for.

First, the current keyword must be entered. Then the new keyword must be entered twice. When one of the above-mentioned conditions is not met the "Ok" button for confirming the change of the password remains greyed out.







The "data" folder is automatically created in the folder selected. Backup copies and log files for the tool are automatically saved here.







After connecting the tool all internal tool data is read out of the tool using the "read" button. Do not double click because this can lead to errors in the software.

# 5 Write write

After configuration of the tool all the changed data is sent to the tool using the "write" button. The button only becomes active after changing configurations or parameters.

6 COM Port

COM5: connected

Message box for the status of the connection with the tool.





The user display shows which user is active (evaluation, administrator,...).





Show or hide the log window or save on the data carrier as a text file. The communication between the tool and the software is recorded in the log.

It is a good aide in those instances when the tool cannot be completely or partially read out. The log file provides detailed information about where the problem is and is intended for technical support. The log con-




tains primarily specific notifications. e.g. in the event of a problem show the log window, save as a .txt file and send it to the technical support.





Each selected element is printed. In this example the current view will be printed.

  Alternatively you will go back one level with one click on the green arrow.

# Navigation Buttons

These elements are only available in the steps. Using these you can toggle between the current view and the next step quickly, in order to compare them. Currently one would go to step 2 with the right arrow and nothing would happen with the left arrow because we are currently in step 1.

Check all entries and send to the tool by clicking on "write".



Many input areas have a limit. If a red box appears around the number which you would like to enter then it is too high, too low, or invalid characters are being used.




### **5 TOOL SETTINGS**



# "manual mode active"

In applications in which the tool is being used as an individual solution this mode can be activated. If a connected tool needs to be quickly tested without being connected to a controller this mode can also be activated. When deselecting the type of enabling must be selected using the drop-down menu.

"enable over"

- "start key"

press the start key 3x in quick succession in order to enable the tool.

- "time"

Enables the tool after time entered in seconds.

- "start key & time"

Combination of function start key and time.

- "barcode"

Enabling through correct barcode scan.

- "external control"

External control issues the enabling.

- "barcode & external control"

After scanning a barcode external control issues the enabling.



## "reverse enabled for open crowfoots"

Is used for open flat drives in particular. By activating the checkbox you can always screw backwards.





## "setup menu"



If this function is selected the program or the process can be changed using the keys under the display, or the torque can be adjusted in Program 1. In order to get into setup mode hold down the start key and push the battery up.

If "scanner selectable" is activated you can now go to the display in setup mode with the yellow display key and confirm by pressing the start key. Then you must still confirm the left adjustment knob (on the left next to the yellow display knob). This way barcodes can be scanned in the emergency strategy or also the network settings.

If you have activated "handmode selectable" you can now go in setup mode with the yellow display key to the display then you must still confirm the left adjustment knob (on left next to the yellow display knob). Now the tool will execute the default program which is identified with a yellow star in the tool manager.



#### 5.4.5 TELEGRAMS

Under communication telegrams you can specify which data the tool should transfer to the external control. It is possible to transfer OK and NOK graphic data. In doing so whether each individual measurement value of the total measurement in the graphic evaluation should be included can be specified or, for example, whether it should only be every 3rd or 4th value (division factor) that should be transferred. What happens if the tool cannot transfer the data can also be determined. The tool can wait for an answer from the control so that the data can then be sent if there is an existing connection.

The communication telegrams tab only opens if the configuration "Wi-Fi" has been activated in the basic settings tab as well as the "external control" release under "general".

#### "send telegram"

Select the communication protocol TG1/TG2

#### "TG Block-PR"

Security function. While the motor is turning no incoming telegrams from the tool will be answered.

## "send ALL OK /NOK"

After the completed screw connection order an additional telegram about the overall result will be sent.

## "graphics"

#### "transmit data"

Refers to the sending of the graphic data.

- OK: OK graphics are being sent.
- NOK: NOK graphics are being sent.
- Reverse: Graphics from the loosening program are being sent.

#### "divisor"

Determines the number of graphic values which should be transferred. *For example:* If a graphic contains 1000 values and the division factor is "2", 500 values are transferred.

## "spool"

## "record in spool"

activates/deactivates the repetition of results telegrams if these could not be sent due to transmission problems.

#### "trials"

Sets the number of repetitions, per telegram, in the event of an error.

## "periode"

Determines the time between the repeated sending of the telegrams.



It is recommended that you select the "automatic" recovery mode. In doing so all previously read out program and settings are reloaded onto the tool again after the update.

"target torque correction factor"

The correction factor is needed primarily in the event of extremely difficult screw connections. In order to reduce exceeding the desired torque value the stop point can be adjusted. A value lower than 1 leads to an earlier stop of the tool.


"actual torque correction factor"	This correction factor is used in order to compensate for friction losses of different drives (flat drives), or extensions. If the torque values of the measurement system and the tool are different these can be adjusted using the correction factor. To this end the torque value of the tool can be divided by the measured torque value of the reference system. The result is then entered as the correction factor. (Nm tool)/(Nm reference system) = factor If you set a current torque correction factor this program will be identified directly in the program overview with a small exclamation point
"reverse until first evaluation"	Loosen is permissible up to the first evaluation in the assembly direction.  For Example: In an already pre-installed part all the screws need to be loosened so that an additional component can be inserted. In the next step all screws are retightened and evaluated.

## 6.2.3 Double-Hit (Rehit)

The function double-hit (rehit) serves to identify already tighten screw connections. If the target torque within the set angle value is reached this screw connection is assessed as a double-hit (rehit). The screw connection process ends. If the "Double-Hit ⇒ NOK" function is also activated the screw connection process is ended and assessed as NOK.

If you only set an angle or time as a target value you must program a torque limit for emergency stop in order to protect workers and the machine from too high a transmission of power.


# **7 PROGRAM EXAMPLES**

In this chapter different examples for the creation of screw programs are described. Please note that the examples are primarily intended to inform you of the numerous options for the tool and its use. It is, however, not permitted to determine which procedure is suitable for your own screw connection and how the parameters of the screw program are determined.

## 7.1 STRATEGY TORQUE CONTROLLED/ROTATION ANGLE MONITORED

To this end a new program will be created which we have called "torque controlled".


Under the "program" tab an additional step will be added to the standard existing step 1. In the area "charcteristics" the value "only if NOK" will be set for "errors per screw", which permits a screw connection to be loosened after a NOK screw connection. With

the "errors per screw" we set the parameters so that an overall NOK is only issued after the third attempt which is assessed with NOK.







Now we selected a different control type under the "gear" tab. With the option "torque-rpm" the rotation speed is controlled depending on the torque achieved. The value "rpm<sub>min</sub>" specifies the switch off speed; when switching off we only want to be 50 rpm. The shiftdown point relates to the target torque to be reached in the program in percent. As soon as it has been reached the tool begins to regulate the speed down, but not slower than "rpm<sub>min</sub>". Because we did not set a stop in the first step and the tool is already turning when it switches into the second step we do not need a start-up ramp. However, in this step the tool should come to a stop when reaching the set torque which is why we are setting "ECO-Stop" in the stop mode, an effective and gentle method of stopping.

Under the tab "strategy" we set the parameters for the screw joint. With these switch conditions we set " $M_{target}$ " at 5.00 Nm; the tool hereby switches off when reaching this torque value. With " $M_{start}$ " the torque is specified from which the angle counting begins. We set it to 50% of the target torque, at 2.50 Nm. In the evaluation we set the upper and lower limits for the evaluation criteria "torque" and "angle". For the torque we tolerate  $\pm 7\%$  of the target torque. The rotation angle must lie between 120 and 180 angle degrees so that the screw connection will be evaluated as OK. In the graphic all evaluation limits are stylistically represented so that a quick overview of the screw joint is provided.

Because we did not set a stop in the first step and the tool is already turning when it switches into the second step we do not need a start-up ramp. 

## 7.3 STRATEGY GRADIENT CONTROLLED/ROTATION ANGLE MONITORED



To this end a new program will be created which we have called "Gradient (Yield)". Under the "program" tab an additional step will be added to the standard existing step 1. In the area "characteristics" the value "NOK" will be set for "reverse after joint", which permits a screw connection to be loosened after a NOK screw connection. With the "error per screw" at "disabled" we set the parameters so that an overall NOK is already issued after the first attempt which is assessed with NOK. For screw connections which are gradient controlled the yield strength of the screw material is used, therefore the effective force, starting from which the material no longer deforms elastically, but plastically. For this reason a screw which has already been stressed above its yield strength cannot be used again.





The first step is parameterized and we switch into the second step, the final tightening. Under the "general" tab we do not need to make any more changes for the charcteristics because this is already automatically set the way we want it during the creation of the step. An aborted start is not permitted and both in the event of an OK - as well as with a NOK assessment of the second step, the program will be ended.





Under the "gear" tab we retained the "rpm" control method. In order to establish a targeted torque we slow the tool down here and set the speed to 50 rpm. Because we did not set a stop in the first step and the tool is already turning when it switches into the second step we do not need a start-up ramp. However, in this step the tool should come to a stop as soon as the torque gradient drops again. For this reason we set "ECO-Stop" in the stop mode; an effective and gentle method of stopping.





Under the tab "strategy" we set the parameters for the screw joint. In the switching conditions we set " $M_{start}$ " to 5 Nm so that the rotation angle counting begins starting at this torque. In addition we set an " $M_{limit}$ " with 10 Nm. As soon as this torque is reached the tool also switches off. The actual desired switch off should take place via the torque gradient. This gradient is the torque rate of increase. Under " $G_{target}$ " we set the value in percent of the maximum value at which a switch off should take place. The tool permanently measures the torque rate of increase during the screwing process; if this suddenly drops due to reaching the yield strength of the screw material the tool realises this and switches off. In our case the switch off occurs as soon as the torque rate of increase drops to 50% of the maximum. In the evaluations we set another rotation angle range of 60 to 120 angle degrees.

For the calculation of the torque gradients one must specify over how many measurement values the rate of increase should be calculated under the "option" tab; to this end we specify 10 values under "gradient average" so that the average is always derived from the last 10 values and the increase to the last average then results in the gradients. The "chord angle" specifies across how many angle degrees the 10 measurement values should be distributed. In our case we want to calculate the average from 10 measurement values across 2 angle degrees.

## **8 THE BARCODE**

With all tools which are equipped with a barcode scanner it is possible to select programs directly using a defined barcode. It is also possible to connect multiple barcodes to one sequence. In this scenario the program is only then started when all the barcodes have been scanned in the correct order.

#### **8.1 BASIC SETTING**

Make sure that your tool is equipped with a barcode scanner. In administrator mode the program enabling can be selected via barcode at any time under "setup" ⇒ "general" ⇒ "process control". See Chapter 5.1.1. tab "process control", page 37.

#### 8.2 BARCODE INTERFACE

Under "programming" 

"barcode" you will find the interface in order to create a barcode and define its function.



In our example the barcode, which must first be scanned in, so the one with the "group no.: 1", is the component identification.

With the barcode screen the parts of the code which are preset are highlighted in green. The framed part is the component number which can vary. It is displayed in the display for monitoring purposes.


The second barcode with the serial number receives "group no.: 2". Here too, there is a preset part.

The serial number, which constantly changes, is framed with the grey sliders as a variable part. It is also used for enable the program as well as for documentation and for display.

The sequence must comply with this configuration. Only after the component identification is scanned does a scan of the serial number lead to enabling of the program.

## 9 SEQUENCE (JOB)


With the HST-Tool-Manager it is possible to create program sequences. In doing so the sequence of the individual programs which should be processed one after the other, is defined. Using this function it is possible to start a preset sequence of programs with one single enabling.

All column widths can be adjusted as desired in order to get a better overview (similar operating principle to Microsoft® Excel). In addition each column can be sorted in ascending or descending order. To do this click on the column head. Enlarge/shrink the column width by pulling and dragging on the edge of the column. ### 12 SAVING AND LOADING OF PARAMETERS


#### 12.1 SAVING / LOADING

In the HST-Tool-Manager it is possible to save all configuration data for the tool in an "xml" or "dat" file. The current status of the tool is frozen in the file and can, in this way, be used for analysis. A duplicate of the tool can also be created using this file. Individual programs or Wi-Fi settings can also be copied. In order to save statistics and graphics data as well these must be read out beforehand. Click on the button in the start window. The storage location is displayed, selected the desired storage location and the desired file type (.xml or .dat). Then click save. The file will be stored in your folder.

When saving screw results in the .dat format less storage space is required than in the .xml format.





### 12.2 LOADING / RETRIEVING

The HST-Tool-Manager offers you the option to load complete or individual settings and programs into the tool. For this work you require the administrator user level. First the tool must be read out, in which changes, an import of files or a restoration is to be completed. Then open the file from which the data is supposed to be overwritten.





### 13.1 USER GROUP SERVICE

The relevant maintenance employee will decide after how many screw connections service on the tool is necessary.

As soon as that number is reached (e.g. 500,000) the tool will display the service symbol in the display. The tool will automatically be locked and must go for service.

Service should serve as a complete inspection of the tool. HS-Technik GmbH also offers this as an external service.

On the display of the tool the "service" symbol will appear when the set service interval has been reached.



On the display of the tool the "MCT" symbol will appear when the set MCT interval has been reached.



The service defined by the maintenance department for this tool must be completed.

#### 13.6 INTEGRATE TOOL IN THE WI-FI NETWORK USING SCAN FUNCTION

In order to now scan the network setup barcode you must select scanner on the display. The function of the display is explained in the operating instructions for the tool.



Hold down the start key and align the scan field on the barcode. The tool will confirm a successful scan with a short signal tone and will then display on the screen that it is connecting with the network.

#### 14.1 CONNECT TOOL USING WI-FI WITHOUT USB

There is the option of parametrizing the tool without an USB using the Wi-Fi connection. An external control is required for this option. At the customer's request the corresponding network data can be saved in the HST-Tool-Manager so that the HST-Tool-Manager can connect using an AdHoc connection with the tool. The parametrisation in this case can be completed wirelessly.



In the case of the HST-Tool-Manager server this is a connection between a computer and a tool.

This type of connection is very rarely used. Here too, and automatic start can be set upon program start. The port needs to be entered and the status of the connection is being illustrated. A manual start is possible using the "start" button.
